Naruki has studied at the prestigious Thomas Ruff in Germany in 2001. Soon after, he exhibited internationally including at the Rotterdam International Architecture Biennale in 2003, as well as the Venetia Biennale in 2004.

He captured urban streets and architecture in the "Street" series, where he visualized societal lifestyles and thought processes through photographs that were perceptively neutral and devoid of any subjectiveness. As seen in the "Portrait" series, in which he uses a large-format camera to photograph family members and people that he met throughout his career, and the "Museum" series in which he captures renowned paintings and its audience in the place where they are exhibited, Struth has continuously expanded his artistic expression while staying true to his principles. Struth's other representative works include the "Landscape" and "Flower" series taken in the European countryside and the "Paradise" series taken in the jungle.

Thomas Ruff

Born in 1958 in Zell am Harmersbach, Germany, Ruff studied photography at the Art Academy in Düsseldorf from 1977 to 1985 with Bernd and Hilla Becher (Becher School), starting with the series "Interieurs", in which he photographed typical interior scenes of German families. His "Porträts", portraits of friends that are enlarged, attracted a lot of attention. In this series, the human face is presented as a spectacle with maximum visibility. Since the end of the 1980s, he began to use digital processing in his photographic works, including the "nudes" and "jpeg" series, in which he manipulated images found on the Internet since 1996. Furthermore, he began to use photographs of Mars and other astronomical objects taken by spacecraft as materials for his "cassini" 2008 and "ma.r.s." 2010. Ruff explores the possibilities of new photography using the vast amount of photographic images available on the internet as material.
